

The Iron Vault

The Iron Vault at Mancelona High School provides free basic needs for students such as clothing, toiletries, and food. The store has been running completely off of community donations. The store helps eliminate physical barriers that might otherwise interfere with socialization, education, and success.

One section of the store has a locker for men, and another for the ladies, and each has a supply of toothbrushes, toothpaste, mouthwash, soap, shampoo, antiperspirant and other toiletries.

Clothing selections available in the store include pants, shirts, sweaters, sweatshirts, dresses, coats, and undergarments. Dresses and formal men's wear for school dances and the prom are also offered. Some clothing is brand new and gently-used clothing is also available.

She worked for the largest youth homeless charity in the country, the Catholic charity Covenant House with locations across North America. Locally, she was the Program Coordinator for Pete's Place Youth Homeless Shelter for two years and recently worked for Goodwill and the Coalition to End Homelessness as their regional Community Systems Liaison. Tara is now pursuing ministry as she seeks religious education in seminary. She attends Traverse City Central United Methodist Church, participating as the youth group coordinator, and is a volunteer for their homeless outreach breakfast and the committee that runs it.

#### United Women of Faith is too "Out of my Comfort Zone" as Jesus is to the Samaritans/Women

At the District Officers meeting in Mancelona on June 10<sup>th</sup> we commented on how few people attend the Day of Bold social action events and how hard it is to convince some units to include mission giving on the

district, conference and worldwide level as opposed to "I prefer to keep our giving local". And that's when the title of this article popped into my head.

Staying where we "comfortable" is nothing new or endemic to the times in which we now live. We avoid the UWF reading program because they choose books that present us with hard truths with which we don't want to wrestle. stop listening to a broad range of news sources because we don't agree with what some of them tell us and don't like feeling angry. We responsibility refuse things that happened "before our time" thereby denying they still happen. We deny we have any effect on climate, or we complain about words and phrases we have used all our lives being called racist. and sneer "politically correct speech."

Did not Jesus present such hard truths to his disciples and the crowds that listened to him? Were they shocked to hear his "jaw dropping" declaration that the Good Samaritan was their neighbor whom they should love? (Politically correct speech; Neighbor rather than Samari-

tan?) We know the disciple's reaction when they return to the well to find Jesus having a theological discussion with a "gasp" Samaritan woman! And Jesus commends Mary for listening to him rather than being in her place "in the kitchen". (A hard truth; women are equal to men?)". Healing the Phoenician woman's daughter (definitely not local).

It is precisely by stretching our comfort zones; wrestling with hard truths, having difficult, grace-filled discussions with those with whom we really disagree, considering why our words might be received harshly by someone different from us, that we grow spiritually beginning to gain new insights into Jesus' teaching and the Way he showed us how to live.

Let us take up the hard work Jesus asks us to do by feeding the hungry, housing the homeless, listening to our friends AND opponents, opening our hearts to uncomfortable information, loving all our neighbors, welcoming the stranger, pursuing justice, and gathering together to learn, stretch, accept, and .....Thy kingdom grow. come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven....." Amen
