It is not too late, though, to learn more and accomplish much. Do you know what a Five Star Woman or Five Star Unit are, or what UMW Mission Today Objectives are?

A Five Star Woman is a woman who, in the course of a calendar year, gives to UMW Missions in 5 different ways (5 Channels of Giving-Individual Pledge to Mission, Special Mission Recognition, a Gift to Mission in honor of someone, a Gift to mission in Memory, and a World Thank

Offering). You can be recognized as a Five Star Woman by giving your gifts and the form (available at the following link: https://www.umwmichiganconference.org/

NWD 2019 FIVE STAR PERS ON OR UNIT Form.pdf) to your UMW Unit Treasurer. And if one lady in a UMW local unit is a Five Star Woman, her unit is automatically a Five Star Unit.

The UMW Mission Today Unit Objectives (see pages 6-7) are a list of a variety of goals grouped by category.

To me, the objectives are guidelines/suggestions becoming a well-rounded UMW unit. Mission Giving is only one of the categories (being a Five Star Unit is one of the goals in that category). The others are Spiritual Growth, Membership, Attendance, Mission Education, and Mission Action. Any local UMW Unit that reports at least eight completed objectives in the calendar year receives a certificate. There are 33 objectives listed on the 2022 Mission Today Unit Objectives form, so lots of options to choose from.

For example: Invite one of your Northern Waters District or Michigan Conference UMW officers to one of your local unit meetings=one of your eight objectives checked off and you get to know someone new and maybe get some fresh

ideas. Using the Daily Prayer Guide (formally Prayer Calendar), response magazine, or programs from your UMW Program book in your meetings, or participating in the UMW Reading program are Education Mission obiectives, and corresponding with elected representatives about social action issues is one Mission Action example. At the end of the year you send your completed form to me and your unit is awarded a certificate at the District Annual Celebration.



We can do this!!! We can boost our giv-

ing to UMW Missions and boost our learning and action in a big variety of ways to help improve life for many women, youth and children on this planet of ours. Blessings to you and I hope we will see many of you at our Northern Waters District Power of Bold Day on May 14th (watch for details and registration information soon!)

minimum of \$60.00 total for all five channels (\$40 SMR and \$5 for each of the other four categories).



FUNDRAISING IDEAS for United Methodist Women to benefit Mission Giving

Bag and Basket Booth	Featuring for-sale baskets, handbags, gift boxes of many sorts, tote bags, shopping bags, knitting bags, coin purses, cosmetic cases, book covers,		
	hampers – everything used to hold and carry articles.		
Bake Sales	Ask members to bring their favorite cakes, cookies, or breads. Sell per item or by the dozen.		
Balloon Popping	Each member who is giving or turns in a pledge form gets to choose a balloon with a prize written on a slip of paper inside, and pop the balloon. Prizes can include small UMW giveaways.		
Balloon-o-Grams	Members pay to have messages tied to helium balloons delivered to fellow members with compliments or encouraging words. Charge \$1, \$2, or \$5 per balloon.		
Book/Media Sale	Ask members to donate gently used or new media, including books, magazines, CDs, DVDs, tapes, and games, to sell. Donate leftover media to a shelter or teen center.		
Candy-Grams	Sell candy-grams to members for a small fee and deliver them on the last day of the campaign or throughout. Try to pick treats that tie into your campaign, for example, Halloween candies if there is a Halloween theme.		
Carnival Games/Olympics	Set up old-fashioned carnival games such as a ring toss, fish pond, and balloon dart throw. Participants donate to enter. Award certificates to the winners of the "games of skill." For Olympics, members compete in crazy "athletic" events for silly prizes. Participants donate to enter and observers pick their favorite entrants. Examples of events: three-legged race, tricycle race, egg push (not hard-boiled!) across the finish line with your chin, mini-golf using beach balls and pool cues, etc.		
Chili Gook-off Contest	Ask members to cook a favorite chili recipe and enter it into a cook-off contest. Invite others to pay \$5 for a tasting. Have a panel of chili "experts" select the official chili champion.		
Cookbook Sales	Have members contribute recipes and put them together in a cookbook. Give away samples of the recipes while selling the cookbooks.		
Cutest Pet Contest	Have members contribute a picture of their pets. Place a jar next to each picture for donations. Whichever picture draws the most donations wins!		
Decorating Contest	Host a decorating contest and charge participants to enter or charge spectators to vote on a winner. Items to be decorated could include a piggy bank, a toy car, a t-shirt, an apron, or anything else you can think of!		
Flamingo Flocking	Make cut-outs of pink flamingos and charge members to "flock" other members' yards with the cut-outs. Charge \$1 per flamingo. The bigger the flocking, the better. Alternatively, sell "Pink Flamingo Insurance" for \$2 to protect yourself from the invasion of these pink pests.		
Flower Power	Ask a local florist to donate flowers. Sell the flowers at church to members. Another great idea is to sell flower bulbs.		
Food Sales	Breakfast, coffee, tacos, sandwiches, pizza, hot dogs with chips, etc.		
Golf Tournament or Putt-Putt Contest	Work with a nearby golf course to get reduced rates. Charge players the regular price with proceeds going to Mission Giving. Humorous prizes can be handed out later at a potluck dinner (shortest drive, highest score, etc.). Set up a miniature golf course at your church. Charge each player to play and award a prize to the player with the lowest score.		
Karaoke Club	Members pay a fee to have a fellow member sing. That person must sing or pay a fee not to sing.
