A Word From Our President

I have recently been spending some time reviewing a History of United Methodist Community House (UMCH) that was written by Patsy

Coffman, West Michigan Conference UMW President 2001-2004. This history chronicles the activities of Methodist Women

who felt called to put their faith into action for their immigrant neighbors in Grand Rapids, Michigan beginning in September 1902. Through the decades the ministries changed as the needs of the community changed, beginning with kindergarten classes for girls, and bible study, citizenship, sewing and cooking classes for women, to opening the first childcare center in the city of Grand Rapids in 1936, and to one of the few nationally accredited child development centers in Grand Rapids in 2023.

The story through the years is one of faith, love, steadfastness, perseverance and flexibility! At one point in the 1940's the building they were using was condemned, but they didn't throw up their hands and declare the task impossible. They did raise funds, repair and improve the facility and continue on their mission. In the 1960's they even collected trading stamps (some of you may remember those) to purchase a station wagon that

allowed their girls choir known as the Community Singers to travel and perform throughout the area. In Hebrews when Paul

instructs us to "run with perseverance the race marked out for us", it is not a sprint, but a marathon! That is the race that United Women in Faith and United Methodist Community House

have been running together for over 120 years, and we aren't done yet. Soon UMCH will be breaking ground on a major, visionary, expansion project. It is big, exciting, a bit scary, and much needed in their community. It will include affordable housing units for seniors, even more child development and childcare space for 0-4-year-olds, a fresh market and more. And as we have been doing for 120+ years, our sisterhood of faith will continue to put our faith into action for United Methodist Community House!






ADULT STUDY

by Rachel Mosher


The 2023 youth curriculum leads youth through eight one-hour

- The Ingathering will go to Community Compassion Network in Mt. Pleasant. Let's replenish their baby pantry with the following:



Program Resources - Reading Program

John Wesley had a passion for reading and he did so mostly on horseback with books propped on the pommel of his saddle and thus he consumed thousands of books as he travelled 50 to 90 miles a day.

Although most of us no longer travel on horseback and we certainly don't recommend that you read a book while driving, I do recommend that you keep a book handy to be read during any waiting time. While waiting in the car for children, while waiting at the doctor's office or any other place



where there is time that would otherwise be wasted is a good time to read a book. I try to always have a book handy.

I hope you are making progress in reading for the reading program. If you struggle with a full

-length

book, then check out the children's books. There are children's books in every category. Let me recommend a couple. How Far Do You Love Me? is an Education for Mission book. It actually is a game that you can play with your kids or



grandkids. Vail's Tales is a Nurturing for Community book. It has four stories written by a nine year old girl before her death. Both are delightful books with wonderful art and meaningful stories for kids as well as adults.

Most recently I finished <u>Four</u> <u>Winds</u>. This book takes place in the Texas dustbowl during the depression. The main character moved to California in hopes of finding a more prosperous future for her two children. This is an excellent book about the strength of

a woman and raising a strong daughter. Life was not always good and happy, but this woman worked hard and was determined to provide a better future for her children.

If you have not already done so, get your Reading Program report for 2022 turned into your district program resources coordinator. The district provides certificates to people who have completed the program, usually at the annual

celebration.

I look forward to meeting you at Mission u in July and will be there with books available to purchase. Don't hesitate to call me if you have questions about the reading program.


